

### **Application Timeline**

July 31, 2020	Applications must be received by the San Diego County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors no later than 5 p.m.
August 26, 2020	From the pool of qualified applicants, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors will post the names of the 60 most qualified applicants. The names will be posted online for at least 30 days.
October 13, 2020	The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors will conduct a random drawing of the qualified applicants at the Board of Supervisors meeting to select eight Commissioners.
October 22 and November 5, 2020	The selected eight Commissioners will meet to choose the remaining six Commissioners from the remaining pool of qualified applicants.







#### D. Experience Qualifications

1. What experience do you possess that demonstrates analytical skills relevant to the redistricting process and voting rights, and demonstrates your ability to comprehend and apply the applicable state and federal legal requirements?

Dr. Arvid Larson, a 20+ year resident of San Diego, received a BS in Electrical Engineering from the Illinois Institute of Technology, and a MS and PhD in Electrical Engineering, with a minor in Computer Science, from Stanford University. Following initial service in the U.S. Navy I have had a professional career in information systems and applied computer technology. This career has included technical and management positions within several leading information systems firms and participation in the formation of two engineering/R&D small businesses as well as heading a information systems consulting practice. Throughout this career I have applied and successfully demonstrated analytic skills in design and development of government information systems that are relevant to those required in direct application of redistricting processes.

I was honored to serve as a member of the 2012-2013 San Diego County Grand Jury and over the period of that year received multiple briefings on government processes given to the Grand Jury by senior local government officials including several County Supervisors and the San Diego County Registrar of Voters. These briefings and related Grand Jury tours included much background and in-depth exposure to County election procedures, the many election districts, and applicable state and federal legal requirements underlying these processes.

This educational background and professional experience serves to demonstrate my ability to comprehend and apply appropriate analytic skills necessary to understand and evaluate relevant redistricting issues, the legal basis for required redistricting, and the application and use of government and commercial information systems to this end.

#### 2. What experience do you possess that demonstrates an ability to be impartial?

As a member of the 2012-2013 San Diego County Grand Jury, I was appointed leader of the Public Works Committee and served as the author or coauthor of six Grand Jury reports (all available on the Grand Jury website). On a variety of issues involving San Diego County, its many cities, and numerous organizational districts my committee and I conducted investigations, interviewed witnesses, made facility visits, analyzed data, documented findings, and developed recommendations to appropriate government entities. All of these activities were performed in a totally impartial and non-partisan manner. At the conclusion of the Grand Jury term, these activities were noted and said to be of the highest Grand Jury standard of thoughtfulness and integrity by the Chief Judge of the San Diego County Superior Court.

Throughout this career in development and analysis of government information systems at both the federal and local level, I believe I have consistently demonstrated an unwavering ability to honestly and impartially apply relevant principles to my professional conduct and analyses. My service on the County of San Diego Independent Redistricting Commission would continue this unblemished path.

3. What experience do you possess that demonstrates an appreciation for the diverse demographics and geography of the County of San Diego?

As a 20+ year resident and advocate of San Diego County, I have studied, toured, and gotten to personally experience the unique and fascinating character of County demographics, geography, personalities, and political issues. My personal curiosity and attempts to better appreciate the many facets and diversity of the County environment have led my wife and I to visit and explore nearly all parts of the County, north county to the Mexican border, east county to the ocean. I have had and continue to have many experiences to this end. I feel I have a deep and relatively up-to-date appreciation of the diverse demographics and geography of the County.

My service on the County Grand Jury over the course of a year provided many information gathering visits to local government facilities throughout the County. In addition, over the years my many meetings and information exchanges with local government officials have added to and reinforced my understandings. I have also participated as a trustee of the Cabrillo National Monument Foundation supporting our County's only National Park, including service as the Foundation's president and Board chair. One role of our Foundation was to assist publicizing the Cabrillo Monument on Point Loma to attract County visitors as well as to provide outreach and Monument tours to County schoolchildren. These experiences have considerably added to my understanding of diverse County demographics and unique sensitivities.

I have also been involved in understanding, addressing, and contributing to ongoing neighborhood issues both in my home district of Pacific Beach as well as many other County locales. I have gotten to know the people, leadership, and background motivators that drive these issues and competing interests. The many facets of the redistricting processes are interlinked with these often competing neighborhood issues. I believe I have the knowledge, background, and appreciation to faithfully serve on the Independent Redistricting Commission.
