Application Timeline

Applications must be received by the San Diego County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors no later than 5 p.m.

August 26, 2020
From the pool of qualified applicants, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors will post the names of the 60 most qualified applicants. The names will be posted online for at least 30 days.

October 13, 2020
The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors will conduct a random drawing of the qualified applicants at the Board of Supervisors meeting to select eight Commissioners.

October 22 and
November 5, 2020
The selected eight Commissioners will meet to choose the remaining six Commissioners from the remaining pool of qualified applicants.



D. Experience Qualifications

State law requires candidates demonstrate experience in areas related to redistricting. Please provide responses to the following questions.

1. What experience do you possess that demonstrates analytical skills relevant to the redistricting process and voting rights, and demonstrates your ability to comprehend and apply the applicable state and federal legal requirements?

In my experiences in earning a chemical engineering degree and as a chemical engineer honed my analytical skills, a hallmark of an engineer. In later years, in my role as a high school chemistry, physics and engineering teacher, I have taught the importance and practice of analyzing data to my students.

I find many times, when people are faced with a problem, they first may leap to a solution without clearly defining the problem. THEN they will define the problem often in terms of the solution they provided initially. In their eagerness to address issues, people may not even realize they have provided a solution before clearly defining the problem, gathering parameters and data, analyzing data and then coming up with a solution to be tested. Following the step by step definition and then the solution of a problem is vital in addressing issues related to the law and people 's rights.

Through my service on several governing boards of non-profits, I have had experience in comprehending and applying the local, state and federal legal requirements. Whether it was working with state and federal grant agencies as a member of the Board of Director of the Barbara Kettle Shelter for Abused Women, or complying with local building and zoning regulators as a member of church councils or successfully meeting budget and educational regulations as a School Board member for SET High in the San Diego Unified School District, I understand the vital nature of comprehending and meeting legal requirements.

2. What experience do you possess that demonstrates an ability to be impartial?

Impartiality is not only a key in science but was a vital part of my upbringin. My father was a highly regarded Probate Judge in Michigan and would stress the importance of respecting all people, regardless of viewpoint, wealth, age, gender, religion, ethnicity.

To be effective as a high school teacher of math and science, I need to continue the respect and impartiality needed to reach all students, encouraging them to do their best regardless of how much they may not value science, my teaching style or my viewpoint.

I am often asked to serve in situations which need impartiality: as a assessor of people getting ready to move from one position to another in my church work; as an evaluator of various classrooms, students or activities in secondary education. I was on a non-partisan school board and have been asked to provide perspective in both professional and non-professional situations since others believe me to be able to gather several reviews and not rush to judgement.

In my work as a adjunct college professor and in my years of service on boards of catechetical ministry, I evaluated people, listened to various problems and helped provide solutions that others valued as impartial.

My political party selection of "no party" also echos my belief in evaluating candidates, proposals and other governance in an impartial manner.

3. What experience do you possess that demonstrates an appreciation for the diverse demographics and geography of the County of San Diego?

My experiences as a teacher in environments ranging from a charter high school in San Diego, to the Juvenile Court and Community Schools at Camp Barrett and to a small private school in Normal Heights have helped me appreciate and opened my eyes to the diversity of our County. By intereacting with youth and their families and guardians I am amazed by the similarities and unique needs throughout San Diego County.

I am familar with East County, living in Alpine and with other areas in San Diego County. I have friends in various areas of the county: HIllcrest, Chula Vista, University City, University Heights, Bonita, National City who have made me a part of their home and shown me the delights (and concerns) of their neighborhoods.

My experiences in 4-H, the Diocese of San Diego, with the Middle Eastern Community and in Education also have helped me appreciate our County's diversity.


