### Unadjusted vs. Adjusted Comparison

- Updated Adjusted P.L. 94-171 and Adjusted 2019 CVAP on 2020 Census Block Geography datasets are now available on our Statewide and County and City level data download pages. The updates are as follows:
  - 1) Modified methodology for calculating populations remaining in blocks where state incarcerated populations were removed for PL94.
     Changes impacted racial/ethnic counts but not total population counts. Additionally, some census tables modified for blocks where state incarcerated populations were reassigned to meet constraints of multi-race categories and other rounding procedures.
  - O 2) Modified methodology for calculating populations remaining in blocks where state incarcerated populations were removed for CVAP. Additionally, some census tables modified for blocks to make conforming adjustment to reassignment of state incarcerated populations and other rounding procedures.
- Adjusted data resulted in a net increase of 3,628 people for San Diego County, increasing the unadjusted County population from 3,298,634 to 3,302,262 (an increase of 0.11%).
  - In other words, the number incarcerated individuals in other California counties that were relocated to San Diego County based on their last known address was greater than the number of individuals incarcerated within San Diego County correctional facilities that were relocated outside of San Diego County.
- Of 28,633 census blocks within the county, 5,586 (19.5%) had a change to total population.
- 10 census blocks decreased in population
  - Largest decline (-3,824) was in the block that includes the Richard J. Donovan Correctional Facility.
  - Other less significant declines occurred in blocks that include the Metropolitan Correction Center San Diego (-894) and the Remote Training Site in Warner Springs/CAL FIRE San Diego Puerta La Cruz Conservation (-166)
- Of the 5,576 census blocks with positive changes, 69% increased by only a single individual, and 98% increased by only 5 or fewer individuals.
  - Only 96 census blocks increased by more than 5 individuals; the highest positive change was for one census block, which increased its population by 17 individuals.
- All five Commissioner Districts were affected by the adjustment.
  - o District 1 decreased by 1,936, based on the Richard J. Donovan Correctional Facility being located with the district.
  - o The other four districts realized population gains between 1,208 and 1,687 individuals.
  - o Ideal population changed from 659,727 to 660,452 and overall range changed from 4.5% to 5.0%, mostly based upon the decrease in population in District 1, which changed its deviation from -2.8% to -3.2%.
