I have lived in Carlsbad for 21 years. I am a member of Citizens for a Friendly Airport.

I am sympathetic to the task you have in appropriately districting San Diego County and respect the variety of opinions being expressed.

I believe that McClellan-Palomar Airport is the one singular property that has the potential to change North County forever. The majority of impact would be to the communities of Oceanside, Vista, San Marcos, and Escondido as well as Carlsbad, which is where the Airport is geographically located. If those communities are not feeling the impact currently, just like sea level rise may not impact all coastal communities today, the potential for impact to them all is enormous.

The Airport impact is noise pollution, which is disruptive to kids and teachers trying to conduct class activity, as well as disruptive to sleep. Extremely Import to consider is that we are also talking about aircraft GHGs, which leave communities within a ten-mile radius most vulnerable to dangerous pollutants like particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, and hazardous air pollutants that impact lungs and breathing.

I am hopeful that our current District 5 can remain in tact with whatever additions the census and the Commissioners deem appropriate. These are the communities that suffer the greatest impact and they deserve a communal voice. That won't happen if Carlsbad and the Airport are separated from the other impacted communities. Please don't disenfranchise these impacted communities by breaking up what is now District 5.
