Chopping up the unincorporated area of Spring Valley requires the community groups to communicate with and answer to two supervisorial offices. This doubles the effort to get political support for the needs of this community. Furthermore, lumping an unincorporated community in with surrounding municipalities reduces Spring Valley's ability to get political support because of the priorities municipalities regularly achieve over the unincorporated areas.

Three out of the four map scenarios chop up Spring Valley. After decades of working to organize, build pride, clean up, and make hospitable this community, Spring Valley gets the short stick on recognition by just being a bargaining chip in Redistricting. This is more than about the biannual elections, this is about the effort to continue to build a viable community with/or against the efforts of politics in San Diego County.

I strongly advocate for the community planning area of Spring Valley to remain wholly in one supervisorial district.
