Greetings County of San Diego Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC), I am requesting that the IRC consider the communities of interest of the various regions of San Diego County when drawing new district lines:

\* The inland agricultural and rural communities should be maintained within one district or two adjoining districts. To include these communities with the urban and coastal communities would dilute the interests of agriculture which contributes significantly to the County's economy. The concerns of urban and coastal areas should be kept in adjoining districts as well.

\* The IRC should also consider maintaining the the SR 67 corridor within the same supervisorial district. SR 67 is one of the most treacherous highways in California. The communities along this route have been working through the BOS district and Cal Trans to coordinate their interests in developing a safe route that will serve the public and commerce. Dividing SR 67 between two supervisorial districts will create inefficiencies and impede communication which would ultimately make this a safer and more efficient highway to serve future residents and business activities.
