Greetings Members of the Redistricting Commission:



We would like to highlight the importance of ensuring that East County's communities of interest continue to have a voice and can see themselves represented within our institutions. Proper representation of all voices within our institutions allows for civil discourse and debate to occur through those institutions. Failure to provide that representation will have ill effects among disenfranchised members of communities of interest and their neighbors. Our concern with the currently proposed maps that combine East County communities of interest along with Central City areas is that they will result in large underrepresented communities of interest in the East County. 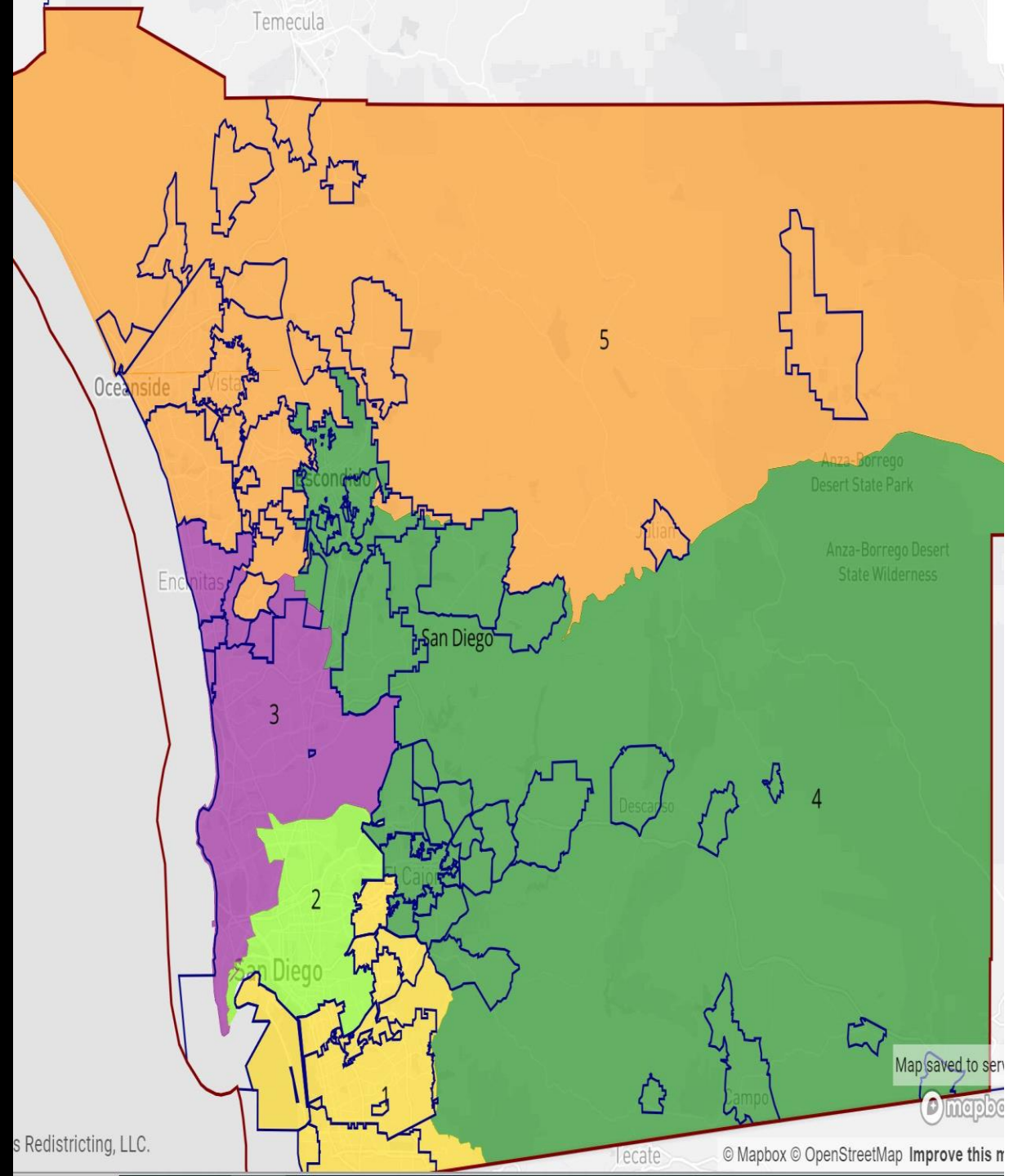
We would speak in favor of further consideration of the attached map.

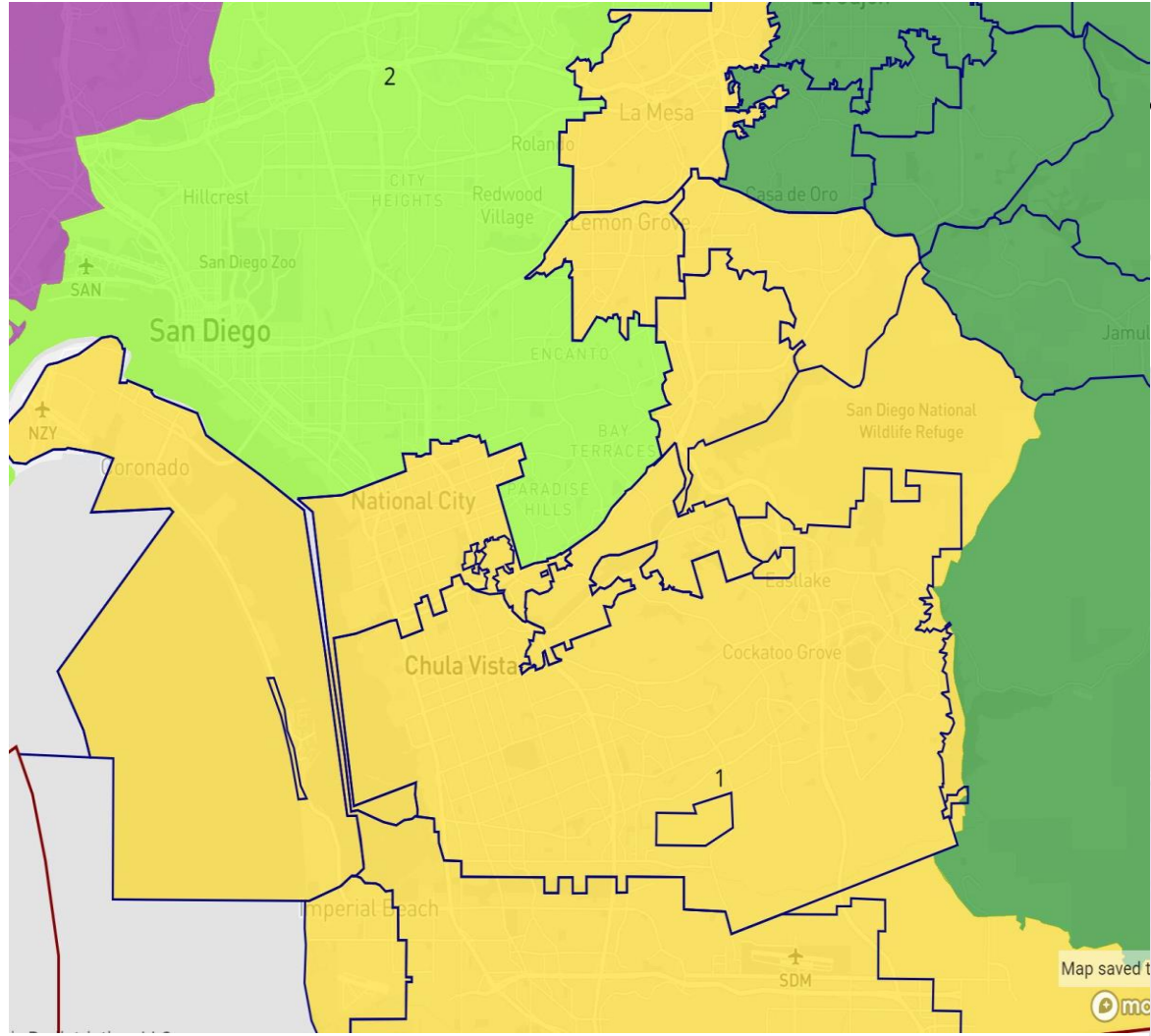

Supervisor District 1

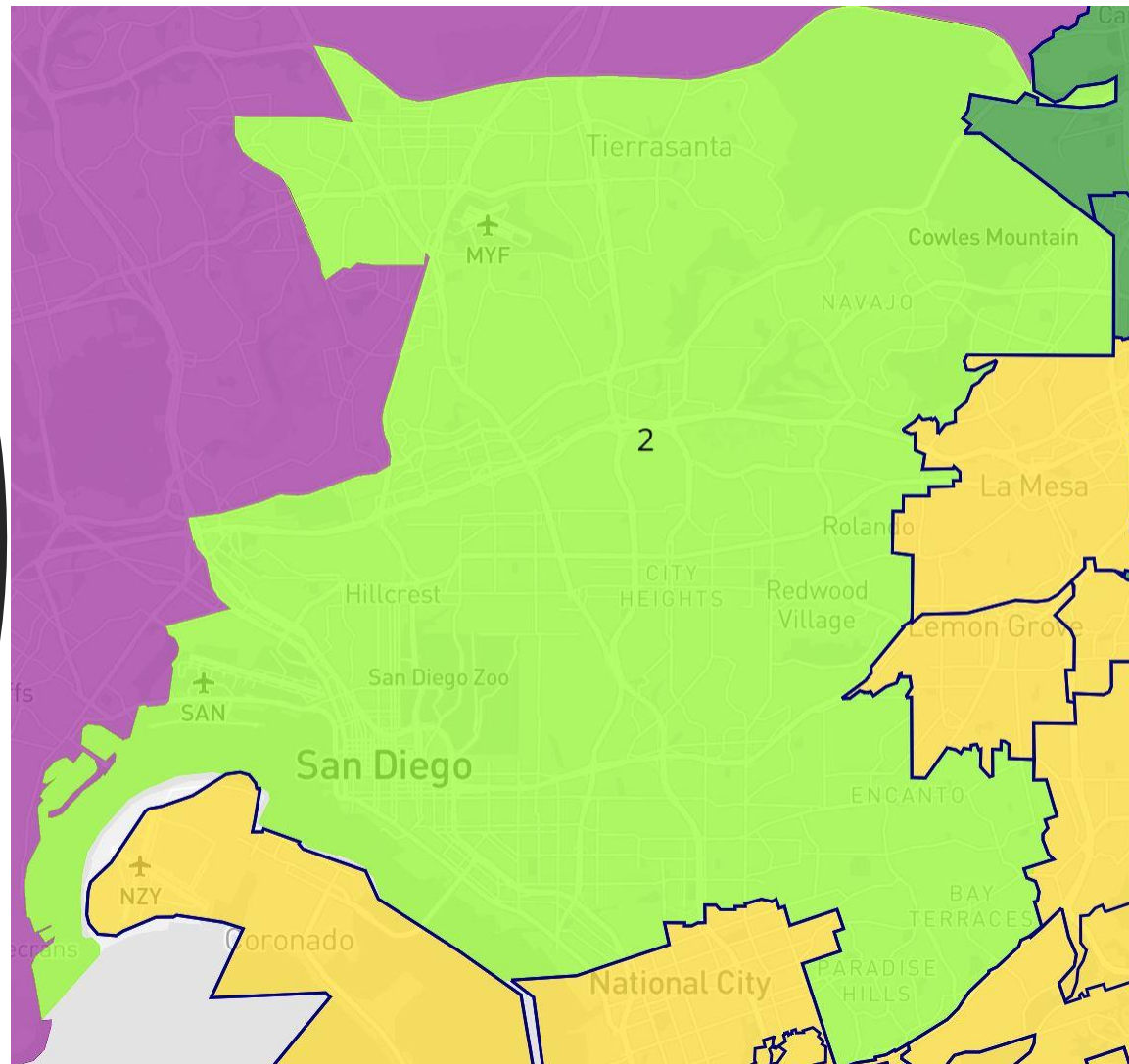

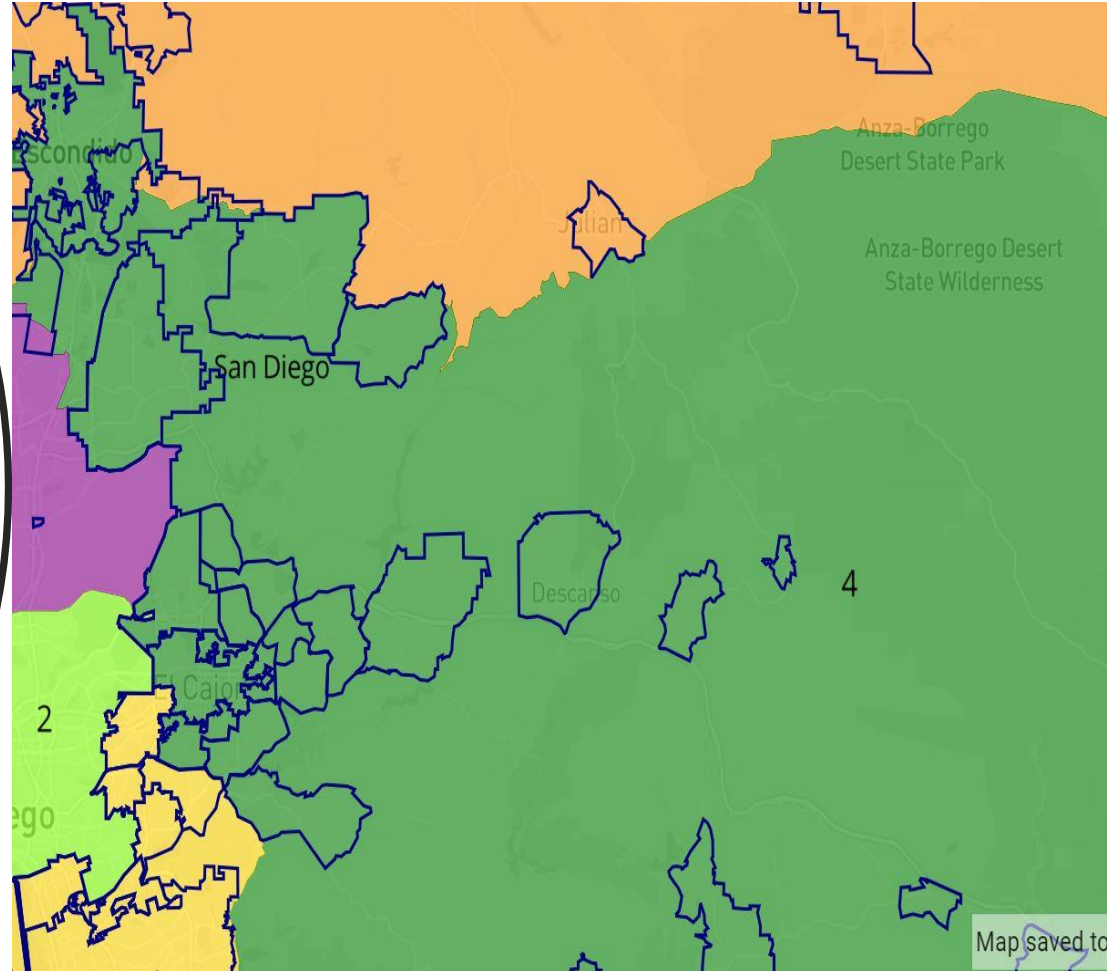

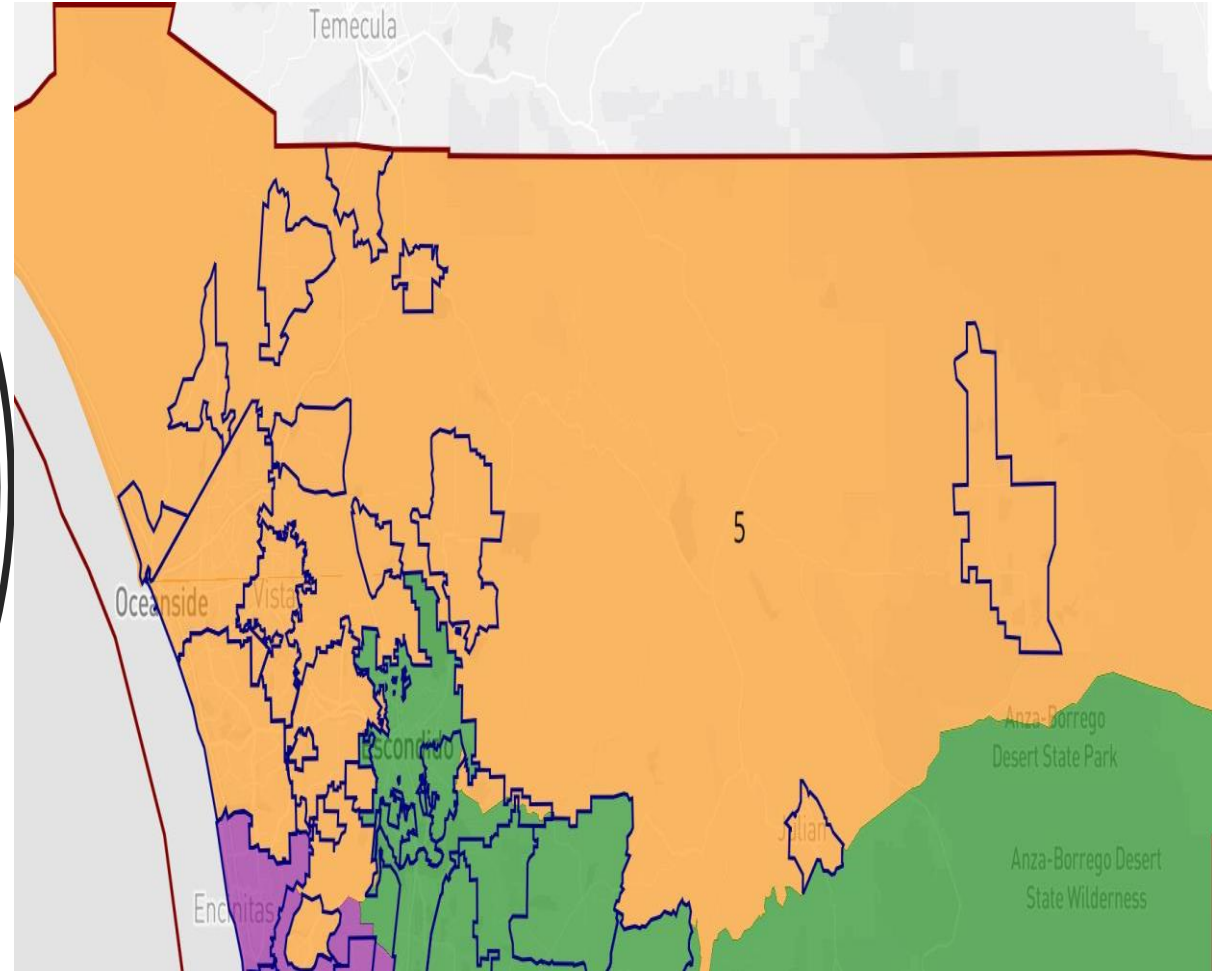
