Good morning Commissioners. My name is Allen Carlisle, I'm the CEO/General Manager at Padre Dam Municipal Water District. We provide water, wastewater, recycled water and recreational services to 100,000 east county residents in the communities of Santee, Blossom Valley, Crest, Harrison Canyon, Alpine and unincorporated portions of east county.

I have great concern over maps being proposed in the context of water supply development and services. In East County we are in the middle of deploying the Advanced Water Purification Project. This is a water reuse project that will create a new local water supply for East County that equates to 30% of supply needs. This project formed a JPA as a governance structure with the City of El Cajon, County of San Diego, Padre, and Helix. All east county communities. This project, that will bring a new local supply of water to our region would likely NOT succeed under the new maps scenarios that divide east county. I bring this example forward as an example of unexpected consequences. Especially related to vital infrastructure.

I strongly support the maps outlined at this website: sdcountyredistrictingmap.org/supervisors. That keeps many of the East County sister communities together.
