Dividing up these local communities cannot be an option. Unfortunately, not enough people know about these proposed maps but it's clear that the people who do, are NOT on the same page as the commission. Draft map 10 specifically does not represent the Latino community interests by merging them into the new additions of other communities from the proposed maps. It is very clear from the local community leaders that the "San Diego County Communities of Interest Redistricting Maps" is the best option to go with.
