In viewing the maps, I see different versions exclude significant parts of the East Region from East County boundaries.

Rancho San Diego, Jamul, El Cajon, and Spring Valley need to stay together with all other East County communities. All have been impacted by fire and share a common interest of fire protection, as well as a common public hospital and emergency department at Sharp Grossmont.

We also share the same rural, business, agriculture, land use and open space interests.

We also share the same corridors of commerce including the 94 and 8, with residents of Jamul, RSD, and Lakeside relying on El Cajon and other East Region communities for shopping, schooling and community events.
