On behalf of the City of Del Mar, thank you for your time and effort developing the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors District Map. After a thorough review of the proposed mapping options, the City of Del Mar endorses Map 13A v.1-6 with the modification that the entire City of Solana Beach be included in the district shown in purple and that the purple district, currently labeled District 4, be District 3 consistent with the existing Board of Supervisors District Map.

By representing the North County coastal communities in a single district, Map 13A v.1-6 maintains connection and continuity for the communities of Del Mar, Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad, and Carmel Valley and environs to the south which share many commonalities, interests, challenges, and resources in terms of transportation, energy, water and wastewater management, school districts, environmental concerns, emergency services, economics, recreation, and employment.

- <u>Transportation</u>: Del Mar is a member of the North County Transit District (NCTD) which provides public transportation services to North County. Proposed Map 13A v.1-6 maintains continuity in the North County's transportation corridors and services that are most important to the North County coastal communities. Additionally, the North County coastal communities have been coordinating on a regional bike share plan, which is currently in progress.
- Energy: Del Mar, Solana Beach, and Carlsbad are founding members of the Clean Energy Alliance (CEA), which provides community choice energy to those communities which share interests in energy and climate goals. While Escondido and San Marcos are in the process of joining the CEA, no southern cities have or are expected to join.

The Del Mar Union School District (DMUSD) provides elementary school service

to Del Mar and Carmel Valley. In contrast, there are few overlapping interests with the City of San Diego school districts primarily serving communities south of Del Mar.

- Environmental Concerns: The North County coastal communities share a variety of common environmental interests such as coastal resource management and planning, the San Dieguito Multiple Habitat NCCP, and participation in the San Dieguito River Park Joint Powers Authority. Specifically, the North County coastal cities share interests and challenges of being in the Coastal Zone such as sand replenishment, bluff and beach erosion, and wetland protections due to similar geography, hydrology, and weather patterns.
