I am the chair of the Alpine Community Planning Group and am making these comments in that role.

Thank you for listening to the overwhelming public feedback you have received from East County. Alpine and East County are distinct COI's and should be maintained to the greatest extent possible.

Map 13a is the map still under consideration that best balances the various issues the IRC needs to consider in drafting its final map. The latest version of this map, 13a V1-6, makes important improvements by keeping Rancho San Diego, unincorporated areas of El Cajon, and Spring Valley with East County. Ideally, the commission would also explore ways to keep the city of El Cajon in the East County district to maintain the integrity of many overlapping school, water, fire protection, and healthcare districts.

Please focus on ways to modify Map 13a. There are too many fatal flaws associated with Map 14. Please keep effective and efficient government at the forefront of your decision making process. Also keep the voices of the residents of East County, specifically those Campo, Potrero, and Jamul in mind as you choose which district they best fit in.
