Dear Commissioners,

I represented Supervisorial District 3 for 20 years. I took office in December 1992, after the 1991 redistricting. There were changes made in 2001 and 2011 to district boundaries. The county has grown in population and these changes must be considered as you draw new district lines. Since you will likely not have 2020 census data until late this year the process will likely be compressed and even more challenging.

It's my recommendation that you seek to follow the basic guidelines that support grouping communities of interest together to create compact districts and not to divide small cities between districts. With that in mind, please consider a District 3 map that encompasses the coastal communities from Encinitas to Point Loma, including University City, La Jolla, Torrey Pines, Sorrento Valley, Carmel Valley, Del Mar Heights, the cities of Del Mar, Solana Beach, Encinitas and the communities of Elfin Forest, Rancho Santa Fe, Pacific Beach, Ocean Beach, Sunset Cliffs, Mission Beach, Loma Portal, and Point Loma. These communities share close social, cultural, and economic ties and are integrated within the I-5 corridor. Not only would such a district serve communities of interest, but it would also ensure that coastal issues—so essential to the San Diego region—are consistently represented on the Board.

Thank you most sincerely for your service in this essential process. It's never easy and I hope you will consider my suggestions.

It's my recommendation that you seek to follow the basic guidelines that support grouping communities of interest together to create compact districts and not to divide small cities between districts. With that in mind please consider a District 3 map that would include University City, La Jolla, Sorrento Valley, Carmel Valley, Del Mar Heights, the cities of Del Mar, Solana Beach and Encinitas, Elfin Forest, and Rancho Santa Fe. These are all coastal communities and are on the I-5 corridor. That would create a compact district of communities of interest.

It would seem the I-15 communities would also benefit by being grouped together in communities of interest in District 5. They then would likely find representatives that best met their needs.
