A district along the border would give voice to so many of our South County residents with family and jobs on both sides of the border. Our kids go to the same schools and camps and sports leagues. Our families face many of the same challenges - quality education, pollution from the port and border, COVID and until this past November, we never had a Latinx County Supervisor representing us. One of the biggest obstacles to having our voices heard is being in the same district as Point Loma and Coronado, which does not face these same challenges and has far different demographics.
