#### Commissioners,

I am submitting this supplement to my testimony given to the Commission at its Preplanning meeting of September 2, 2021 by letter and Zoom.

I ask that the contents of this email, along with the attached file from the SD County Clerk of the Board (COB) archives be added to the public record and distributed to Commission members. The attached file consists of official County documents relating to actions of the SD County Board of Supervisors (BOS) at a series of meetings held in July, 2001 for redistricting Supervisorial District boundaries following the 2000 Census. The series of meetings culminated in the adoption of Supervisorial District boundaries changes onJuly 31, 2001. Of concern is the gerrymandering of District 3, which I wrote about in my letter to the Commission and spoke about by Zoom at the meeting.

Following is a chronology and summary of the documents contained in the attached records, beginning with the February 13, 2001 meeting of the SD County Redistricting Advisory Committee, and ending with the BOS adoption of Ordinance 9365 on July 31, 2001 establishing new boundaries of the five districts.

#### **OVERVIEW:**

On July 17, 2001 (15), your Board introduced Ordinance for further Board consideration and adoption on July 31, 2001.

On July 10, 2001, the Board held a public hearing to receive and consider the Redistricting Advisory Committee's recommended redistricting plans, Draft Plan No. 11 and Draft Plan No. 13 (1). The Board concurrently considered "Minor Amendments to Redistricting Advisory Committee Draft Plan No. 13" submitted by District 4 (2), and "Proposed Alternative of 2001 Supervisorial Redistricting Map Based on Draft Plan No. 13" submitted by District 5 (3).

The Board directed the Chief Administrative Officer to return on July 17, 2001, with a redistricting plan that combined and reconciled Draft Plan No. 13 as modified by the District 4 and District 5 submittals, added census tract 29.05 to District 4, and moved census blocks within census tract 134.10 in the Spring Valley Planning Area to District 2. The Board also directed the Chief Administrative Officer to return on July 17, 2001 with an ordinance reflecting this plan.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to Sections 400 and 400.1 of the San Diego County Charter and Sections 21500 and 21500.1 of the Elections Code, and after giving consideration to those provisions and applicable decisions of the courts, the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego hereby adjusts and redefines the boundaries of the supervisorial districts of the County of San Diego as hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. The County of San Diego is divided into five supervisorial districts as hereinafter described. Each supervisorial district shall include all of the territory within the San Diego County census tracts and portions thereof listed after the number of the respective supervisorial district. Each supervisorial district bounded by the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean shall include all that territory of the County of San Diego lying west of and between the shoreline and the westerly boundary of the State of California.

Section 8. The San Diego County census tracts referred to in this ordinance are those census tracts established for the federal decennial census in San Diego County. Whenever in the foregoing sections a portion of a census tract is included within the boundaries of a supervisorial district and is described as that portion within or outside the boundaries of the incorporated cities within San Diego County, the boundaries of that supervisorial district within that census tract shall follow the corporate boundaries of those cities as they existed on July 17, 2001.

Section 9. Ordinance No. 7983 (New Series) is repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after the date of its passage. Before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage, it shall be published once in the San Diego Daily Transcript, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego, with the names of the members voting for and against the ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS AND REDEFINING THE BOUNDARIES OF ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS OF THE COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 7983 (NEW SERIES)

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to Sections 400 and 400.1 of the San Diego County Charter and Sections 21500 and 21500.1 of the Elections Code, and after giving consideration to those provisions and applicable decisions of the courts, the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego hereby adjusts and redefines the boundaries of the supervisorial districts of the County of San Diego as hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. The County of San Diego is divided into five supervisorial districts as hereinafter described. Each supervisorial district shall include all of the territory within the San Diego County census tracts and portions thereof listed after the number of the respective supervisorial district. Before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage, it shall be published once in the San Diego Daily Transcript, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego, with the names of the members voting for and against the ordinance.

I'm writing to you as you are my county supervisor.

While we reside in Poway, your district, we own 5 acres in Harmony Grove. We would like to express our extreme opposition to Bill Horn's proposed redistricting map for several reasons:

1. Elfin Forest and Harmony Grove are precious jewels in the county consisting of vast amounts of open space. This area is home to many threatened and endangered species. One only need visit the Elfin Forest Preserve to enjoy the vast open space. We both sit on the board of the Harmony Grove Eden Valley Citizens Group, and as such we are in tune with what the residents of HG & EV want. Recently our group has asked to be removed from Escondido's sphere of influence. This is being studied by the LAFCO board, which you serve on. Supervisor Horn likes to allow large housing developments to proceed on a rapid scale and pace. Supervisor Horn doesn't appear to be concerned with preserving rural areas or considering traffic impacts before approving many projects.

- 2. I believe Supervisor Horn wouldn't hesitate to approve SC1375 and make Country Club Dr. a four lane high speed heavy traffic road connecting 78 to 15. Supervisor Slater would not approve such a road that serves only to allow freeway traffic to pour through the Harmony Grove and the Via Rancho Parkway corridor and is so completely unwanted by the local residents!

We wonder if we should even consider moving on after what we saw. Why did the Board even have the meeting when the decision was already made and the will of the public was going to be ignored.

#### REDISTRICTING OF COUNTY SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS

On behalf of the San Diego County Board of Supervisors, you are invited to participate in a series of public meetings to be conducted by the San Diego County Redistricting Advisory Committee on the subject of redistricting the County's five supervisorial districts.

After the Federal Census every ten years, the County Board of Supervisors is required, if necessary, to adjust the County supervisorial districts so that they are as equal in population as possible. The boundaries to be drawn in this year's redistricting will determine which of the five County supervisorial districts you will vote in beginning with the March, 2002, primary election and continuing to the year 2011.

The County Board of Supervisors has directed that there be opportunity for broad community participation in the redistricting process. To provide for this input by interested individuals and groups, the Redistricting Advisory Committee will be holding five community meetings, one in each supervisorial district, and six additional meetings to be held at the County Administration Center. The first will be held on February 16, 2001, 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the County Administration Center. This meeting will be devoted to organization of the Redistricting Advisory Committee, preliminary discussion of the redistricting process, and solicitation of initial input on redistricting priorities. Subsequent meetings, which will be more substantive, will be held at the times and locations in the attached schedule.

The Board of Supervisors and the Redistricting Advisory Committee will solicit public participation through various means. Interested individuals can request to address the Redistricting Advisory Committee at its public meetings. In addition to the public meetings, public outreach efforts will include posting redistricting information on the County's website at <a href="https://www.co.san-diego.ca.us">www.co.san-diego.ca.us</a>. The public can submit comments and proposed plans at the public meetings, via electronic mail to <a href="mailto:redstrct@co.san-diego.ca.us">redstrct@co.san-diego.ca.us</a>, or via U.S. mail to:

Thereafter the Redistricting Advisory Committee will develop proposed plans to be submitted to the Board of Supervisors by the end of June. The timeline that has been established is necessary to allow the Registrar of Voters to make timely preparations for the March 2002 Primary.

- 1. schedule of date, times, and locations of Redistricting Advisory Committee meetings;
- 2. redistricting timeline;
- 3. map of the current supervisorial districts;
- 4. criteria and guidelines for the County to follow in making any boundary adjustments; and


#### 2001 REDISTRICTING CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES

#### Applicable Legal Standards

- 1. The County of San Diego is divided into five legally apportioned districts. (San Diego County Charter Section 400.)
- 2. The principal legal standard governing redistricting is the "one person, one vote" rule that requires supervisorial districts to be as nearly equal in total population as possible. This requirement is based in federal law, as well as California Elections Code section 21500.
- 3. The area of at least two supervisorial districts shall be as substantially outside the City of San Diego as the population will permit. (San Diego County Charter Section 400.1.)
- 4. In creating district boundaries, the Board of Supervisors may give consideration to the following factors:
  (a) topography; (b) geography; (c) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity and compactness of territory; and (d) community of interests within the districts. (Elections Code Section 21500.)
- 5. District boundaries shall also comply with the federal Voting Rights Act, as applicable.
- 6. Redistricting shall be completed no later than November 1, 2001. (Elections Code Section 21501.) However, due to administrative requirements imposed upon the Registrar of Voters in connection with the March 2002 primary election, the Board of Supervisors intends to adopt redistricting plans by ordinance no later than August 2001.
- 7. It is necessary to hold at least one public hearing on any proposed redistricting plan prior to the public hearing at which the Board of Supervisors votes on the proposal. (Elections Code Section 21500.1.)

#### Additional Criteria

- 1. With the exception of the City of San Diego and to the extent possible, individual cities will not be divided between districts.
  - 2. Where possible, dividing census tracts will be avoided.


