My name is Khue Tran and I am with Asian Solidarity Collective. I have been worked in Carlsbad for 4 years. I live in Mira Mesa but commuted daily; I spent a significant amount of my time around Palomar Airport Road, and frequently traveled to San Marcos, Vista, and downtown Carlsbad within my community.

The community is mainly comprised of renters, English language learners, and large families, and many prioritize affordable housing/English as Second Language services, public transportation, and educational access.

I am writing to you today to emphasize the importance of keeping Carlsbad/Vista/San Marcos/Escondido united in one district, as well as including our Muslim, Immigrant, and Refugee community of interest in North County together in a single Supervisorial district. As an someone who grew up in an immigrant community, it is vital to recognize that the majority of us speak a primary language other than English at home, and are limited English proficient. I see the community as being defined as: Carlsbad, San Marcos, Vista, and Escondido, and we define our COI as BIPOC, Immigrant & Refugee. These cities must be united in a single District to ensure that our shared needs as BIPOC immigrants and refugees, such as affordable housing, equitable transportation access, and English Language Services, are adequately addressed by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors.
