#### **Program Overview**

- Development impact fee adopted by the Board of Supervisors as the Fire Mitigation Fee Program in 1985
- Revenue can only fund capital facilities and equipment to serve new development
- 13 participating fire agencies throughout the unincorporated area of San Diego County









## **Eligible Expenditures**

Fire Station Construction

Aerial Trucks

Chief's Vehicles

Engines (Type 1, 2 and 4)

#### Additional Requirements:

- Capital Projects identified by Resolution approved by the participating fire agency's Board of Directors
- Annual financial reporting per the San Diego
   County Ordinance and California Government
   Code
- Infrastructure categories eligible to receive funding identified as by Nexus Study as planning level costs of the fire related infrastructure



## Nexus Study Requirements

Effective 2022, AB 602 set forth several new requirements for impact fee programs:

- Nexus study required
- Must identify the existing level of service for each public facility, identify the proposed new level of service and explain why the new level of service is appropriate
- Adoption of capital improvement plan required
- Adoption of nexus study at a public hearing with 30 days notice
- Studies shall be updated every 8 years

## **Fee Calculation Method**

Infrastructure

- Fire Stations
- Aerial Trucks
- Engines
- Chief's Vehicles

**Standard** 

Existing Infrastructure
Service Population

**Example:** 1 Fire Engine for every 10,000 People

Cost to Implement the Standard

Infrastructure Cost
Standard

Example:

\$1,030,000 Per Engine 10,000 People Served

Cost: \$103 Per Person

**Total Fee** 

Sum of the cost per person to implement all infrastructure types

Example:

Fire Stations: \$700

Aerial Trucks: \$20

Engines: \$103

Chiefs Vehicle's: \$15

Total: \$838

Per Person
