RESIDENT ADVISORY BOARD PARTICIPATION ANNOUNCEMENT September 10, 2019

As a resident of Public Housing or a participant of the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program in the Housing Authority of the County of San Diego (HACSD), you may be eligible for appointment to the HACSD's Resident Advisory Board! This voluntary position gives you a chance to talk about how Public Housing and HCV policy affects you. You will represent other residents and participants in the areas served by HACSD.

The role of the Resident Advisory Board (RAB) is to help HACSD put together the Agency Plan each year. The RAB will also meet to talk about important changes being considered throughout the Plan year. The RAB will assist and make recommendations regarding the Section 8 Administrative Plan, the Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy (ACOP), and the Family Self-Sufficiency Action Plan.

Eligibility for Resident Advisory Board Selection

- Resident must be directly assisted under the Public Housing or Section 8 HCV Program in the HACSD's jurisdiction. This includes Project Based Vouchers (PBV) and VASH.
- Resident must be a Public Housing tenant or HCV participant in good standing, i.e. meeting all family obligations under the Public Housing or Section 8 program
- Resident's name must be listed on the lease
- Resident must be at least 18 years old
- Resident must be willing to participate in training and orientation
- Resident must be willing to attend regular Resident Advisory Board meetings
- Resident must avoid conflicts of interest

Term of Office

The initial term of the appointment to the Resident Advisory Board will be for three (3) calendar years. The resident is eligible for re-appointment if the resident meets all eligibility requirements and expresses an interest in a reappointment.

As a resident of the HACSD, your voice matters! By getting involved on the Resident Advisory Board you can steer decisions about housing programs. Help us in our mission to build healthy, safe and thriving communities.

If you are interested in being considered for a position on the Resident Advisory Board beginning November 1, 2019, you must submit an application in writing. Applications will be accepted through October 11, 2019. Eligible candidates will be notified for an in person interview prior to selection.
