- Data through September 30, 2025.
- County contracts to administer permanent housing subsidies for the "County Contract Jurisdictions" were executed in May 2024 and participants began transitioning from emergency housing into permanent housing in July 2024.
- County (OHS) administers grant in County Unincorporated areas and on behalf of Santee and Caltrans.
- City of San Diego administers all services for their portion of grant. City received funding via sub-recipient grant agreement in May 2024 and is facilitating services; City of San Diego outcome data not included here.
