



Housing and Community Development Services - Office of Homeless Solutions (HCDS-OHS) focuses on collaborative and coordinated outreach and case management services via multi-disciplinary partnerships to assist people experiencing or at risk of homelessness. In addition to providing direct services OHS also works on planning, developing, and implementing programs that serve specialized populations of people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

<p>OHS Regional Homeless Services**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ OHS Regional Homeless Services are multi-disciplinary teams of outreach staff that connect individuals to self-sufficiency programs (CalFresh, CalWORKS, Medi-Cal, General Relief), social workers that provide case management and housing navigation, and a Licensed Mental Health Clinician that provides clinical case management, as well as consultations to their peers. □ These teams are the lead outreach entity in the Unincorporated areas of County and partner with City jurisdictions' multi-disciplinary outreach teams, community partners, Caltrans, MTS, and North County Transit District to provide services countywide.
<p>Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP)**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Housing and Disability Advocacy program provides individuals who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness and likely eligible for disability benefits with outreach, case management, time-limited housing subsidies, and benefits advocacy while they are seeking disability benefits, primarily Supplemental Security Income (SSI). □ Services are provided Countywide. Referrals into program are made by OHS Regional Homeless Services staff who identify clients that meet the program criteria.
<p>Regional Homeless Assistance Program (RHAP)**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ RHAP is an emergency housing program that supports people experiencing homelessness within the unincorporated areas of the county by utilizing local hotel/motel vouchers as emergency housing. Program provides individuals with outreach, transportation, case management, and permanent housing navigation support. □ Referrals are made through the OHS Regional Homeless Services
<p>Specialized Funding for Imminent Needs (SFIN)**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Specialized Funding for Imminent Needs program provides financial support for people at risk of or experiencing homelessness to address barriers to housing stability. Flexible funds help expedite housing placement and increase stabilization.
<p>Magnolia Safe Parking**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Safe Parking, operated by County contractor Dreams for Change, offers overnight parking for people experiencing homelessness with support services (housing navigation, meals, and case management).
<p>Bancroft Safe Parking**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Primary service area is Unincorporated San Diego County, and referrals are made by OHS Regional Homeless Services who identify clients that meet the program criteria.
<p>Grantville Safe Parking**</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Although the Grantville location is not in the unincorporated area of the County, the program still prioritizes those experiencing homelessness in the unincorporated areas.



Contracted Programs

<p>Housing Our Youth (HOY)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Housing Our Youth program provides up to 24 months of specialized assistance to youth and young adults up to and including the age of 24 years (at time of enrollment) who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness. Services include peer support, care coordination, service navigation, housing and tenant support, transportation, employment and education assistance, and other wrap-around services. □ YMCA is the lead contractor in partnership with a consortium of six other youth service providers. □ Referrals into program: Housing Our Youth YMCA of San Diego County (ymcasd.org)
<p>Community Care Coordination Re-entry Support (C3RES) Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Program provides up to 12 months of comprehensive care coordination, service navigation, peer support, and housing related assistance to people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness who are justice involved, including those impacted by Proposition 47 exiting from any county jail. □ Referrals into program come from Probation, the Public Defender, and the Sheriff.
<p>Alternatives to Incarceration (ATI)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Alternatives to Incarceration program provides up to 12 months of comprehensive care coordination, service navigation, peer support, and housing-related assistance to individuals who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness and have interacted with or are at risk of justice system involvement. □ Union of Pan Asian Communities (UPAC) is the lead contractor and subcontracts with NAMI. □ Referrals to the contactor come through justice system partners.
<p>LGBTQ+</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Program provides housing and supports such as roommate and shared housing matches, linkages to host homes and other safe living situations, mediation services, problem solving, conflict resolution, family of choice reunification, temporary housing, case management, security and utility deposits, move-in assistance, housing navigation, referral to eviction prevention services for members of the LGBTQ+ community. □ Referrals can be made directly to providers: The Center: The San Diego LGBT Community Center (thecentersd.org)



Contracted Programs

<p>Domestic Violence Shelter-Based Programs</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ County supports domestic violence shelter providers across San Diego County for survivors of Domestic Violence that provide information, referrals, linkages to services and shelter beds. □ There are currently three contractors who provide shelter services throughout the County. □ Referrals to programs can be made through the following 24/7 hot lines: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Center for Community Solutions (East and North County, Coastal): 888-385-4657 ◦ Community Resource Center (North County): 877-633-1112 ◦ SBCS (South County): 800-640-2933
<p>Building Partnerships Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ OHS grant program for private entities that can apply for grant opportunity to purchase sleeping cabins and set up as emergency shelters on their private properties. □ To apply for time limited grant opportunity: HCDS-OHS.HHSA@sdcounty.ca.gov
<p>Inclement Weather Program (IWP)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Provides temporary emergency hotel/motel shelter during periods of inclement weather in one of 7 zones across unincorporated San Diego □ Inclement weather includes excessive heat, cold or rain. □ Referrals into program during inclement weather episodes can be made through 866-886-3231.
<p>Local Rental Subsidy Program (LRSP)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Local Rental Subsidy Program supports households in the unincorporated area of the county who are experiencing homelessness by providing subsidized rental assistance for up to 24 months for those exiting Compassionate Emergency Solutions and Pathways to Housing programs.
<p>Housing Stability Case Management Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Participants receiving the LRSP are offered housing stability case management to support their long- term housing stability and retention for up to the duration of their housing subsidy.
<p>Home Safe</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ The Home Safe program provides short-term housing stabilization services, including advocacy, case management, and housing navigation for older and dependent adults who are victims of abuse, neglect, financial exploitation, or self-neglect, resulting in risk of homelessness and/or recent homelessness. □ Services are provided Countywide. Referrals to the program can be made through County’s Adult Protective Services hot line 1-800-799-7233.
<p>Pilot Shallow Rental Subsidy Program (SRSP)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Program is serving 382 senior households with \$500 monthly subsidy paid directly to landlords. □ Referrals are not currently accepted as program has reached capacity.
