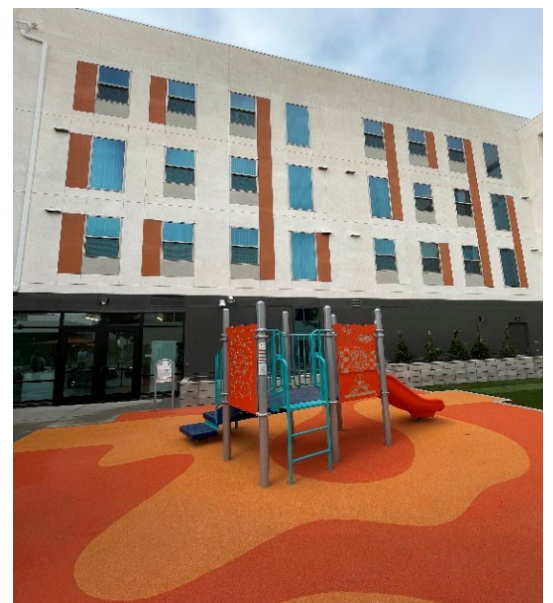


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INTRODUCTION

The County of San Diego, Housing and Community Development Services (HCDS) advances the Health and Human Services Agency mission by coordinating County efforts in addressing homelessness, improving quality of life in low-income neighborhoods, and providing pathways to affordable housing to help vulnerable populations achieve stability and self-sufficiency.

The **Housing Resource Directory and Homelessness Service Guide** was prepared by HCDS to provide residents and the community agencies that serve them with information on affordable housing resources available to low- and moderate-income households. This document also provides resources for people experiencing homelessness.

These rules say no one can be treated unfairly because of their race, skin color, religion, where they are from, if they are male or female, if they have kids, or if they have a disability.

COUNTY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Housing Authorities run programs like Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher, Project Based Voucher, and other housing programs funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). These programs provide rental assistance for low-income and other vulnerable populations. You may be eligible for one or more of the rental assistance programs. The amount of rental assistance you get is based on your income and family size. See the “**County Rental Assistance Program Descriptions**” section in this document to learn more.

How does the voucher work?

When you get a voucher, it helps pay part of your monthly rent. You are responsible for finding a place to live (like an apartment, house, duplex, etc.) where the landlord agrees to accept the voucher. The Housing Authority of the County of San Diego (HACSD) will pay their part of the rent directly to the landlord. You pay the rest, which is usually 30% of your adjusted monthly income. What areas does the Housing Authority of the County of San Diego serve?

HACSD provides services in the unincorporated areas of the County of San Diego, and the cities of Chula Vista, Coronado, Del Mar, El Cajon, Escondido, Imperial Beach, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, Poway, San Marcos, Santee, Solana Beach, and Vista. The cities of San Diego, Carlsbad, Encinitas, National City, and Oceanside run their own housing programs. If you want help in those cities, you will need to apply directly with them. What are the income limits for rental assistance?

You may qualify for rental assistance if your income is less than 50% of the Area Median Income (AMI). Federal rules also require that at least 75% of new participants in the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program have an **extremely low income**, which means their income is below 30% of the AMI. You can check the current income limits here: [Income Limits AMI Chart](#). Please note, some programs listed under “County Rental Assistance Program Descriptions” may have their own income limits.

How do I apply for a rental assistance program?

If I do qualify, how long does it take to get help?

We can’t give an exact time for how long you may wait on our waitlists. This is because it depends on the money we get from HUD. Right now, we don’t have enough funding to give out new vouchers. While waiting, many people look into affordable housing developments. See the “**Countywide Affordable Housing**” section in this document to learn more.

How does the waiting list work?

To apply for HACSD’s housing programs, you must first fill out a pre-application to get on the waiting list. Being on the list does not mean you will get help. Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers

The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program, also known as “Section 8,” is a federal program that helps low-income families and individuals pay for safe and healthy housing. New vouchers are given out based on how many are available and the amount of funding from the federal government. For additional information, please visit: [Section 8 HCV Overview](#).

Project-Based Housing Choice Vouchers

The project-based part of the HCV Program provides rental assistance for specific units within affordable housing developments. These developments are run by development partners, and each site has its own waitlist and admissions requirements. For additional information, please visit: [Project-Based Vouchers](#).

Public Housing and Farmworker Housing

The Housing Authority of the County of San Diego (HACSD) owns and operates 121 public housing units located in four locations in Chula Vista, and 38 farm worker housing units in San Marcos. One of the Chula Vista locations is for seniors and people with disabilities. The other Chula Vista rental units are for low-income families. The San Marcos property is for low-income families whose earn their income from farm or agricultural work. This property follows rules set by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Development Agency. For additional information, please visit: [Public Housing](#).

Moderate Rehabilitation Program

The Moderate Rehabilitation Program offers privately owned rental units in East County for low-income families. There are about 32 of these units in El Cajon. COUNTYWIDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Housing and Community Development Services (HCDS) helps make more affordable housing for people with low incomes and those who need extra support. HCDS does this by giving loans and funding to developers to buy or build affordable housing. In most cases, people who earn up to 80% of the average income in the area may qualify to live in these affordable housing developments. To qualify, you must have an eligible income and meet other eligibility requirements. Each housing development may have slightly different income limits and eligibility requirements.

The [County-Restricted Affordable Housing Map](#)¹ lists information about affordable housing properties across the region. See the “**Summary of Properties on the County Restricted Affordable Housing Map**” on page 9 to find the list from the County-Restricted Affordable Housing Map. How do I apply for affordable housing?

To apply for affordable housing, you will need to contact the properties listed in the [County-Restricted Affordable Housing Map](#) directly to ask if they have available units. If units are not available, ask to be placed on the waiting list if they have one. When a unit opens, the leasing office will contact you. After you are on the waiting list, it is a good idea to call the property now and then to check your status and update your contact information.

How long can I expect to remain on a waiting list?

Each property has its own waiting list, and the waiting times can be different for each one. Contact each building directly to ask about their waiting lists.

What is an income limit? What does an income limit mean?

The income limit for an affordable housing program is the highest amount of total income (all the money you earn before taxes and other deductions) that a household can make based on the County’s Area Median Income (AMI). Programs vary in the income range requirements. For additional information, please visit: [Income Limits AMI Chart](#).

How is affordable rent determined?

Each affordable housing property has set rent prices based on different income levels. The County checks the properties listed on the [County-Restricted Affordable Housing Map](#) every year to make sure rents stay within the limits and that tenants still qualify to live there.

How can I locate affordable housing?

¹ All the affordable housing developments shown on the map were partially funded by the County and offer rent-restricted housing for people who qualify under a variety of programs and income levels. The developments categorized as existing meet the state of California’s accessibility requirements as of the date of their construction completion.

OTHER HOUSING PROGRAMS

Down Payment and Closing Cost Assistance

If you are a first-time homebuyer with a low income (earning 80% or less of the area's average income), you may qualify for help buying a home. The County of San Diego has partnered with the San Diego Housing Commission (SDHC) to manage the Downpayment and Closing Cost Assistance (DCCA) Program. Moderate Income Down Payment Assistance Program

Moderate income, first-time homebuyers who are 120% or below the Area Median Income, may qualify for a low-interest, deferred payment loan (no payments on the loan until you refinance, sell, pay off the first mortgage, or no longer occupy the property as your primary residence) for down payment assistance. The County of San Diego has partnered with SDHC to administer the Down Payment Assistance (DPA) Program. For more information, please visit: [Moderate Income Down Payment Assistance](#).

Home Repair Program

The Home Repair Program provides loans or grants to eligible home and mobile homeowners for minor home health and safety repairs. To qualify, homeowners must live in unincorporated San Diego County or in one of the following cities: Coronado, Del Mar, Imperial Beach, Lemon Grove, Poway, or Solana Beach; the homeowner must have lived in the home for at least 12 months prior to the approval of the application; and the household annual income must be at or below 80% of San Diego's Area Median Income (AMI) ([Income Limits AMI Chart](#)). COUNTY HOMELESSNESS PROGRAMS

Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS)

Housing and Community Development Services, Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS) helps people who are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless. Through the OHS Regional Homeless Services team, outreach staff help connect individuals to self-sufficiency programs (CalFresh, CalWORKs, Medi-Cal, General Relief), case management and housing navigation, and collaborates with city and community partners to deliver services. OHS also has programs for people with specific needs in different areas of the County and serves people living in the unincorporated areas of the County, based on the zip codes list below.
